• **OWU Advising notes:**

With a few exceptions, courses in Psychology are categorized into three tiers. As the prerequisite for all other psychology courses, Introduction to Psychology (PSYC 110) is the only course in Tier 1. Students must complete Introduction to Psychology with a C- or better grade to be eligible to enroll in Tier 2 courses. The following seven courses comprise Tier 2:

- PSYC252 Social Psychology
- PSYC255 Clinical Neuroscience
- PSYC258 Psychology and the Law
- PSYC262 Health Psychology
- PSYC264 Organizational Behavior(also listed as EMAN 264)
- PSYC282 Adolescent Psychology
- PSYC284 Psychological Adjustment

One freshman honors tutorial may count as a Tier 2 course, but two tutorials cannot complete the requirement. All other psychology courses except for Quantitative Methods(PSYC210), Advanced Quantitative Methods(PSYC420),Research Methods(PSYC310), Advanced Research Methods (PSYC410),Independent Study (PSYC490), Directed Readings(PSYC491), and Apprenticeship (PSYC495) are categorized as Tier 3 courses. The prerequisite for taking a Tier 3 course is successful completion of two Tier 2 courses.

**Major: a minimum of nine units of credit in psychology.** The major consists of three core courses: Introduction to Psychology (PSYC110), Quantitative Methods(PSYC210), and Research Methods(PSYC310).In order to enroll in Quantitative Methods, students must successfully complete PSYC110 and one additional psychology course in Tier 2. A minimum of 6 additional elective units of credit in the department are required with at least one unit of credit from each of categories A through E listed below. The remaining unit(s)can be from any category. Credit/no entry courses will not count toward the major.
