
TRUTH, JUSTICE AND RECONCILIATION:

Doomed to Separate Paths?

Charlie Clements, Executive Director of the Carr Center for Human Rights Policy at the Harvard Kennedy School, will share lessons from his long career of human-rights advocacy. He will

examine some of the human-rights tragedies of recent decades in Latin America – the military coup and dictatorship in Chile, the so-called 'dirty war in Argentina, the genocide directed against Mayans in Guatemala, as well as the death squads in El Salvador who killed a Bishop, American nuns, and Jesuit leaders – and will explore the challenges of those who have pursued truth, justice, and the possibility of reconciliation.

A film about his work in El Salvador, *Witness to War*, won the 1985 Academy Award for Best Documentary Short.
