

Distinguished Achievement Citation

Edward D. Miller Class of 1964

With this presentation of Ohio Wesleyan's Distinguished Achievement Citation, we recognize and celebrate the impressive accomplishments of Dr. Edward Miller.

In early 1997, Dr. Miller was named to the newly created joint post of Chief Executive Officer and Dean of the Johns Hopkins University school of Medicine. This appointment followed his service for a year as Interim dean, and concurrently makes him Vice President for Medicine of the University and the 13th Dean of the medical school faculty.

Dr. Miller is superbly qualified for his prestigious position, having had stellar academic and professional experience.

Following graduation from Ohio Wesleyan with a pre-med major, he earned his medical degree at the Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry. He then took a surgical internship at University Hospital in Boston, later training in anesthesiology at Peter Bent Brigham Hospital, where he became chief resident and completed a research fellowship physiology at Harvard. From there, he transferred to Brooke Army Medical Center in Texas, where he served as director of anesthesia research and assistant chief of anesthesia and operative service. In 1975, he joined the faculty of the University of Virginia as president of the clinical faculty. After eleven years at Virginia, he went to Columbia University to chair the Department of Anesthesiology and to serve as Vice President of the executive Committee of Presbyterian Hospital's medical Board. Later, he spent a sabbatical year as senior scientist in the Department of Pharmacology and Physiology at Hospital Necker in Paris.

Now nationally known as an authority on anesthetic drugs, Dr. Miller is author or co-author of more than 150 scientific papers, abstracts and textbook chapters in his field and is an editor of the journal Critical Care Medicine and secretary-treasurer of the International Anesthesia Research Society.

Dr. Miller is a native Rochester, New York. He, his wife, Lynne, and their four children live in Baltimore County, Maryland.

It is a privilege to honor Dr. Edward Miller, an exemplary son of Ohio Wesleyan, and to applaud him for his outstanding contributions to the world of medicine.
