Dr. Kira Bailey, assistant professor of neuroscience, psychology, Ohio Wesleyan University



Dr. Kira Bailey joined the faculty of Ohio Wesleyan in 2015 after completing a postdoctoral fellowship at University of Missouri-Columbia. She teaches courses in neuroscience for the Psychology Department and the Neuroscience Program. Her research examines how individual differences in experience, such as video game exposure and alcohol sensitivity, modifies brain activity related to cognitive control and affective information processing. She has 26 peer-reviewed publications in top-tiered journals, including *Pediatrics*, *Psychopharmacology*, *The Journal of Abnormal Psychology*, and *Psychophysiology*, where her work was the most downloaded article of 2010. This year she is guest editor for a special issue titled “The Impact of Digital Media Use on Behavior and Brain Function” in the *International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health*.

Dr. Vicki DiLillo, professor of psychology, Ohio Wesleyan University



Dr. Vicki DiLillo received her PhD in clinical health psychology from the University of Miami and completed a postdoctoral fellowship at The Ohio State University. She has been a member of the Ohio Wesleyan psychology department since 2004. She teaches a variety of courses in the areas of clinical and health psychology. Dr. DiLillo’s research focuses on modifiable risk factors for

cardiovascular disease, like obesity, physical activity and stress, as well as strategies for enhancing health behaviors among college students. In addition to having over 20 peer-reviewed publications, Dr. DiLillo has served as an investigator on several NIH-funded grants. Dr. DiLillo was the recipient of the 2008 Ohio Wesleyan Sherwood Dodge Shankland Award for the Encouragement of Teachers, as well as the Libuse L. Reed Endowed Professorship in 2013.
