With great pleasure, Ohio Wesleyan presents an Alumni Award to Earl E. Warner, Class of 1926.

For twenty-six years, Earl was a member of the Politics and Government faculty at Ohio Wesleyan, and is remembered by generations of alumni as “Pops” Warner. He retired from teaching in 1972.

Earl has not retired, however, from taking an active interest in Ohio Wesleyan. He has continued meaningful involvement in several ways. As unofficial historian of the University, he has written a history of the political science department, and is always in demand as a speaker on the school’s early days.

He keeps in touch with former students and helps alumni maintain contact with each other and the University. A familiar figure at various alumni events, he has also participated in most of the Summerweek programs as either speaker or “student.”

Earl continued involvement with Alma Mater serve as a reminder of Ohio Wesleyan’s proud past and its commitment for a bright future rooted in a treasured past.
